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SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS

Request for Proposal (RFP) documents, including any addenda, are available on the Purchasing website at https://www.co.isle-of-wight.va.us/departments/budget and finance/rfps and ifbs.php and on the Commonwealth's bid board (eVA) http://eva.virginia.gov/. Questions concerning this solicitation must be in writing (email is preferred) and addressed to ewishall@isleofwightus.net and shall be received no later than May 10, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. Email is the preferred method for asking questions and will get a faster response, but other written forms are acceptable.

Offers should be sent to ewishall@isleofwightus.net as a pdf attachment to an email. Electronic copies may also be delivered to the Purchasing address on the cover page via a USB flash drive prior to the closure date and time shown. The electronic submittal shall be less than 150 MB, shall be saved as a pdf document, and should conserve space whenever possible to allow easy transfers of data. Short but concise submittals are appreciated.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTALS

Isle of Wight County shall not be responsible for any expense incurred by the firm in preparing and submitting a proposal, or expenses incurred related to subsequent inquires/interviews and contract negotiations. All proposals submitted shall become property of the County. Proposals must be signed by the principal of the firm authorized to negotiate and contract for the work. Proposals are to be delivered as an electronic document. The subject line/title should show the proposal number and name. Only electronic documents sent or delivered as indicated within this RFP shall be considered. Proposals must be received by Purchasing no later than 3:00 p.m. local time, on the date specified for receipt of proposals.

The intent of using electronic submissions is to reduce the use of paper, and provide a faster, more economical approach that will permit the offeror to describe their skills, education, experience, pricing, and ingenuity that would qualify them to be selected for interviews. Offerors selected may be allowed to make a formal presentation of their qualifications and may be selected for inclusion on a qualified list of firms eligible to receive a contract. If you need any reasonable accommodation for any type of disability in order to participate in this procurement, please contact the Purchasing Agent as soon as possible.

We do not have means to keep a complete plan-holders list, or the names of firms that have downloaded copies of the RFP from various websites. Please check the County's website prior to submitting your proposal to ensure that a complete, up-to-date package has been received.

In compliance with this RFP, and subject to all the conditions thereof, the undersigned offers, if an offer is accepted within one hundred and twenty (120) calendar days from the date of the subsequent offers for particular projects, the Offeror shall furnish the services upon which prices were negotiated for the project. The undersigned certifies he has read, understands, and agrees to all terms, conditions, and requirements of this RFP, and is authorized to contract on behalf of the firm.

PURPOSE

Isle of Wight County is seeking Professional Architectural services for miscellaneous small (less than \$100,000 in fees) projects that may arise during the contract period. The scope of work may require the preparation of feasibility reports, design and preparations of plans, cost estimates, appearances before public bodies and/or community groups and civic organizations, and representing the County with local, state, and federal agencies. This solicitation is intended for projects wherein the professional fees will be less than \$100,000 per project. It is anticipated that many projects will require fees of less than \$60,000. For larger projects, stand-alone RFP's will be issued.

TERM OF CONTRACT

Isle of Wight County expects to enter into agreements with up to three firms to provide Architectural services for a one-year term beginning with the notice of award. The contract shall be renewable for four additional one-year terms at the County's option.

BACKGROUND

This solicitation is to replace prior agreements and contracts advertised and awarded in prior years. The services may be required by, but are not limited to, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Tourism, the Department of Economic Development, the Economic Development Authority (EDA), the Department of Parks and Recreation, or other associated agencies or departments as may require such work.

- Building design (emphasis on public facilities)
- Structural design/inspection

PROPOSAL PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

Responses to this RFP shall include submittal items as described below. Email submittals shall be less than 150 MB including attachments. Larger files cannot be processed. Short, but concise submittals are appreciated. Submittals should provide support for each of the elements included in the Evaluation Criteria listed to follow.

SUBMITTALS

The Consultant shall provide the following:

- A cover letter defining the Offeror's interest and qualifications to provide the services needed.
- A description of the firm's overall capabilities and experience, more specifically for assigned project team members.
- Typical work plan with method to control costs and provide timely turnaround for projects.
- A listing of any joint venture or sub-consultants expected to be utilized on projects.
- Experience in dealing with sustainability issues, including environmental, energy, and best business practices.
- Experience in permitting through federal and state agencies and with public relations and outreach.
- General availability in emergency situations.
- References from other localities contracting for similar services.
- The complete RFP with appropriate signature sheets executed and other information as required.

EVALUATION CRITERIA AND AWARD PROCESS

The County's Evaluation Committee shall review each proposal and make a selection of proposals that will be considered further. A numerical rating system will not be used. The evaluation shall be made for each proposal on the basis of the criteria listed below. Each criterion will be evaluated based upon the strengths and weaknesses of the submittal, and any subsequent information gained in the process, or known to the County. The criteria are listed in order of importance.

- A. Experience and qualifications of key firm personnel assigned to the proposed contract and relative to the representative tasks outlined.
- B. Access to appropriate resources and availability to respond quickly.
- C. Typical work plan and method to control costs and provide timely turnaround for projects.
- D. Overall quality and completeness of proposal.
- E. Prior History with or knowledge relating to Isle of Wight projects.
- F. References from other localities contracting for similar services.

In addition, the substance of proposals will carry more weight than the form, or manner, of presentation. The quality and clarity of proposals may affect the Committee's perception of the Offeror's overall qualifications to provide quality services.

The procurement of these services shall be in accordance with procedures of the Virginia Public Procurement Act, Competitive Negotiation for Professional Services. Once the Evaluation Committee has read and considered each proposal against the criteria, a consensus of the Committee shall be reached to establish a ranking of the proposals. This ranking shall be used to select firms for further consideration—the short-list. The Evaluation Committee will then conduct interviews with firms considered fully qualified for each contract.

In order to ensure availability of services, following interviews the County may select up to three firms, ranking them for future negotiation on projects. Those selected will be awarded a contract that will govern individual awards as projects are determined. The file will show the Committee's perception of the strengths and weaknesses of each proposal received as compared with the published criteria. This shall be the basis for award and shall be part of the official file. After notice of the County's intent to award, the successful firm will be expected to enter into a contract with Isle of Wight County based upon their submittal, any negotiated terms and final pricing. The successful firm shall execute and return the contract documents to the County within ten (10) days of receipt for final review and execution.

Once the decision to award, or an award is made, all candidates will be notified. Prior to a decision to make an award no information will be released.

When individual projects arise during the contract term, the County will enter into negotiations with the firm ranked highest for that contract and make an award to that firm, if negotiations are successful. If an agreement cannot be negotiated, the County will break off negotiations with that firm for that particular project and enter into negotiations with the firm ranked second, as required under the Virginia Public Procurement Act. If a firm is found to be unable to perform or enter into negotiations for a given project, the County will go to the next highest ranked firm and open negotiations. Should the County determine, in its sole discretion, that only one Offeror is qualified, or that one Offeror is clearly more highly qualified than the other under consideration for a particular project, a contract may be negotiated and awarded to that Offeror.

PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by an offeror in connection with this solicitation shall not be subject to disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act; however, the offeror must invoke the protections of this section prior to or upon submission of the data or other materials and must clearly identify the data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary. Offerors shall not mark sections of their proposal as proprietary if they are to be part of the basis of an award of the contract or are otherwise of a "Material" nature. Any proprietary information must be listed on the attached "Proprietary/confidential Information Identification" form and submitted with the proposal.

CONDITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS Rev: 11/22/2016

- 1. <u>Use of Form</u>: All proposals should be submitted in electronic (.pdf) format in accordance with this form. The offeror may attach/scan other information as required to the electronic document that will be made a part of the proposal. Electronic submittals on USB memory sticks will be accepted if delivered prior to the closing time. The preferred method is by an attachment to an email addressed to: ewishall@isleofwightus.net The County's published Conditions and Instructions shall supersede any additional writings submitted with the proposal. Such writings shall be clearly marked and noted as an exception.
- 2. <u>Submittals</u>: Except as noted above, all proposals shall be sent as an attachment to an email to: ewishall@isleofwightus.net . The subject line should show the proposal number and name.
- 3. <u>Late Proposals</u>: Proposals and amendments thereto, sent electronically to Purchasing and received after the date and time specified, will not be considered. It will be the responsibility of the offeror to see that their proposal is received before the time specified. There will be no exceptions. Electronic proposals sent as an email attachment will show the date and time sent. These must be received prior to the closing date and time as published on the front cover.
- 4. <u>County Offices Closures</u>: Should the County's offices be closed, or if its electronic networks connectivity prevents receipt of proposals at the time of the scheduled proposal closing, the proposals will be opened on the next business day of the County, at the original scheduled hour, or as soon as connectivity is restored during normal business hours.
- 5. <u>Non-discloser:</u> RFP's are not opened publicly or released to the public until later in the process. The names and number of responses shall not be disclosed until negotiations are complete and a decision to award has been made. At that time, the file will be made available for review.
- 6. <u>Offer/Acceptance</u>: Each proposal is received with the understanding that the acceptance in writing by the County of the offer to furnish any or all of the goods and/or services described therein, shall constitute a contract between the offeror and the County, which shall bind the offeror to furnish and deliver the goods and/or services quoted at the prices stated and in accordance with the conditions of the accepted proposal; and the County on its part to order from such offeror, except for causes beyond reasonable control; and pay for, at the agreed prices, all goods and/or services specified and delivered.
- 7. <u>Withdrawal of Proposals</u>: Proposals may be withdrawn (cancelled) any time prior to the closing time and date. Withdrawal of proposals may be accomplished by submitting such request in writing on the issuing company's letterhead either by email, in person, or by certified mail.
- 8. Addenda: If issued, addenda to this solicitation will be posted on the County's website (http://www.co.isle-of-wight.va.us/budget-and-finance/) and on the Commonwealth's bid board (eVA) http://eva.virginia.gov/. It is the Offeror's responsibility to check either website or contact the Purchasing Division prior to the submittal deadline to ensure that the offeror has a complete, up-to-date package. Acknowledgement of all issued Addenda shall be indicated on the proposal form in the appropriate spaces.
- 9. <u>Award</u>: Award will be made to the offeror(s) considered at the County's sole determination after following the procedure outlined herein. The process used for this solicitation shall be Competitive Negotiation for Professional Services as outlined in the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
- 10. **Announcements**: Upon award or the announcement of the decision to award a contract, the County will publicly post such notice on the bulletin board located in the County's Administrative Offices and on the County's web site:

- 11. <u>County's Rights</u>: The County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, and to waive any informality if it is determined to be in the best interest of the County.
- 12. <u>Delivery</u>: The time of delivery of services must be stated in definite terms. If time of delivery for different goods and/or services varies, the offeror shall so state.
- 13. <u>Silence of Specifications</u>: The apparent silence of these specifications and any supplemental specifications as to any detail or the omission from the specifications of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail and correct type, size and design are to be used. All interpretations of these specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement.
- 14. <u>Capacity of Offeror:</u> All proposals must be signed by a responsible officer or employee having the authority to bind the firm in contract. The offeror agrees that its contract performance shall be in strict conformance with the contract documents.
- 15. <u>Cooperative Agreements:</u> If authorized by the bidder(s), the resultant contract(s) may be extended to any local jurisdiction within the Commonwealth of Virginia to purchase at the contract prices in accordance with the contract terms so long as allowed by the respective governing body. Any jurisdiction using such contracts shall place its own order(s) directly with the successful contractor(s). The County of Isle of Wight acts only as the contracting agent and is not responsible for placement of orders, payment, or discrepancies of the participating jurisdictions. It is the contractor's right to notify other jurisdictions of the availability of contract(s). Restrictions for some public bodies may apply under the Procurement Act.
- 16. **Rights to Damages**: By signing this proposal, the offeror assigns to the County any and all rights that it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia in any way arising from or pertaining to this proposal. This provision is remedial in nature and is to be liberally construed by any court in favor of the County.
- 17. Anti-collusion: The offeror certifies by signing this Request for Proposals that this proposal is made without prior understanding, agreement, or accord with any other person or firm submitting a proposal for the same goods and/or services and that this proposal is in all respects bona fide, fair, and not the result of any act of fraud or collusion with another person or firm engaged in the same line of business or commerce. Any false statement hereunder may constitute a felony and can result in a fine and imprisonment, as well as civil damages. Should sub-Consultants or sub consultants have interest in multiple submittals, this clause does not apply except when an act of collusion or fraud.
- **Indemnification**: The Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the County, and the County's employees, 18. agents, and volunteers, harmless, from and against any and all damage claim, liability, cost, or expense (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs) of every kind and nature (including, without limitation, those arising from any injury or damage to any person, property or business) incurred by or claimed against the Consultant , its employees, agents, and volunteers, or incurred by or claimed against the County, the County's employees, agents, and volunteers, arising out of, or in connection with, the performance of all services hereunder by the Consultant. This indemnification and hold harmless includes, but is not limited to, any financial or other loss including, but not limited to, any adverse regulatory, agency or administrative sanction or civil penalties, incurred by the County due to the negligent, fraudulent or criminal acts of the Consultant or any of the Consultant's officers, shareholders, employees, agents, Consultants, sub-Consultants, or any other person or entity acting on behalf of the Consultant. Unless otherwise provided by law, the Consultant indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be limited in any way by the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the Consultant under worker's compensation acts, disability benefit acts, other employee benefit acts, or benefits payable under any insurance policy. This paragraph shall survive the termination of the contract including any renewal or extension thereof. (Isle of Wight County has no legal authority to indemnify others. Firms submitting responses agree that

they will not require the County to indemnify them in any resulting contract.)

- 19. <u>Copyright Protection</u>: The Consultant agrees to defend and save the County, its agents, officials, and employees, harmless from liability of any nature or kind, for use of any copyright, composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, articles or appliances furnished or used in the performance of the contract, or which the Consultant is not the patentee, assignee, or licensee, to the same extent as provided in the above paragraph.
- 20. <u>Laws, Regulations</u>: The Consultant shall keep fully informed of all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations that in any manner affect the conduct of the work. The Consultant shall at all times observe and comply with all such laws, ordinances and regulations.
- 21. <u>Alien employment</u>: The Consultant certifies that he does not and shall not during the performance of the contract for goods and services in the Commonwealth, knowingly employ unauthorized aliens as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended.
- 22. <u>SCC Authorization</u>: All offerors authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth pursuant to Title 13.1 or Title 50, as amended, shall include the identification number issued to it by the State Corporation Commission. Any offeror that is not required to be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a foreign business entity under Title 13.1 or Title 50, as amended, or as otherwise required by law shall include in its proposal or proposal a statement describing why the offeror or offeror is not required to be so authorized.

SCC Number, or Statement:	
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Any business entity that enters into a contract with a public body pursuant to this chapter shall not allow its existence to lapse or its certificate of authority or registration to transact business in the Commonwealth, if so required under Title 13.1, or Title 50, as amended, to be revoked or cancelled at any time during the term of the contract. The County may void any contract with a business entity if the business entity fails to remain in compliance with the provisions of this section.

- 23. <u>Default</u>: In event of default by the Consultant, the County reserves the right to procure the goods and/or services from other sources and hold the Consultant liable for any excess cost occasioned thereby. Such actions taken by the County shall not release the Consultant from additional remedies that may be allowed by law.
- 24. **Availability of Funds**: When a contract resulting from this solicitation involves multiple fiscal periods, such contract shall be deemed in force only to the extent of appropriations available to each department for the purchase of such goods and/or services. The County's extended obligations on those contracts that envision extended funding through successive fiscal periods shall be contingent upon actual appropriations for the following years.
- 25. <u>Appeals Procedure</u>: Upon your request, administrative appeals information will be provided that shall be used for hearing protests of a decision to award, or an award, appeals from refusal to allow withdrawal of proposals, appeals from disqualification, appeals for debarment or suspension, or determination of non-responsibility and appeals from decision or disputes arising during the performance of a contract. To be timely all appeals shall be made within the time periods set forth by the Virginia Public Procurement Act, §2.2-4357, et seq. Contact the buyer at once for assistance.
- 26. **Faith-based Organizations**: Isle of Wight County does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.
- 27. Anti-Discrimination: By submitting their proposals, offerors certify to the County that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians with Disabilities Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act and 2.2-4311 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA). If the award is made to a faith-based organization, the organization shall not discriminate against any recipient of goods, services, or disbursements made pursuant to the contract on the basis of the recipient's religion, religious belief, refusal to participate in a religious practice, or on the basis of race, age, color, gender or national origin and shall be subject to the same rules as other

organizations that contract with public bodies to account for the use of the funds provided; however, if the faith-based organization segregates public funds into separate accounts, only the accounts and programs funded with public funds shall be subject to audit by the public body. (Code of Virginia 2.2.4343.1E).

Every contract over \$10,000 shall include the following provisions:

- 1. During the performance of this contract, the Consultant agrees as follows:
 - a. The Consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, service-disabled veterans or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Consultant. The Consultant agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - b. The Consultant, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Consultant, will state that such Consultant is an equal opportunity employer.
 - c. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting these requirements.
- 2. The Consultant will include the provisions of Section a, b, and c above in every subcontract or purchase order over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each sub-Consultant or vendor.
- 28. <u>Drug-Free Workplace</u>: During the performance of this contract, the Consultant agrees to (1) provide a drug-free workplace for the Consultant's employees; (2) post in conspicuous place, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the Consultant 's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (3) state in all solicitation or advertisement for employees placed by or on behalf of the Consultant that the Consultant maintains a drug-free workplace; and (4) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each sub-consultant or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a Consultant, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

- 29. <u>Assignment of Contract</u>: A contract shall not be assignable by the Consultant in whole or in part without the written consent of the County.
- 30. <u>Independent Consultant:</u> The Consultant and any employees, agents, or other persons or entities acting on behalf of the Consultant shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees, or agents of the County.
- 31. Scheduling and Delays: The parties to any contract resultant of this solicitation acknowledge that all or part of the work to be performed hereunder may be delayed and extended at the option of the County. Such delays may be caused by delays, denials and modifications of the various state or federal permits, or for other reasons. The County shall not be required to pay any of the Consultant's direct or indirect costs, or claims for compensation, extended overhead, or other damage or consequential damages arising out of or related to any delays or interruptions required or ordered by the County. If the County delays the project for any reason for a continuous period of ninety (90) days or more, the County and Consultant will negotiate a mutually agreeable adjustment to the Consultant's award amount. Notwithstanding the above, in construction contracts, to the extent that an unreasonable delay is caused by the act or omissions of the County due to causes within the County's control, the above waiver or release shall not apply.

32. Governing Law: This Agreement is made, entered into, and shall be performed in the County of Isle of Wight, Virginia, and shall be governed by the applicable laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia without regard to its conflict of law rules. In the event of litigation concerning this Agreement, the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Circuit Court of Isle of Wight, Virginia; however, in the event that the federal court has jurisdiction over the matter, then the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Norfolk Division.

The Consultant shall not cause a delay in services because of the pending or during litigation proceedings, except with the express, written consent of the County or written instruction/order from the Court.

- 33. <u>Severability</u>: If any provision of a contract resulting from this solicitation, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall to any extent be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this contract, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those which it is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected hereby, and each provision of this contract shall be valid and enforced to the full extent permitted by law.
- 34. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>: The County may at any time, and for any reason, terminate this Contract by written notice to Consultant specifying the termination date, which shall be not less than thirty (30) days from the date such notice is mailed.

Notice shall be given to Consultant by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Consultant's Proposal or as provided in this Contract. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall be paid such amount as shall compensate Consultant for the work satisfactorily completed, and accepted by the County, at the time of termination. If the County terminates this Contract, Consultant shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under this Contract, and turn over to the County any work completed or in process for which payment has been made.

After the first contract term the Consultant may at any time, and for any reason, terminate the Contract by written notice to the County specifying the termination date, which shall not be less than thirty (30) days from the date such notice is mailed.

35. <u>Termination for Cause</u>: In the event that Consultant shall for any reason or through any cause be in default of the terms of this Contract, the County may give Consultant written notice of such default by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Consultant's Proposal/ or as provided in this Contract.

Unless otherwise provided, Consultant shall have ten (10) days from the date such notice is mailed in which to cure the default. Upon failure of Consultant to cure the default, the County may immediately cancel and terminate this Contract as of the mailing date of the default notice.

Upon termination, Consultant shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under the Contract, and turn over to the County any work in process for which payment has been made. In the event of violations of law, safety or health standards and regulations, this Contract may be immediately cancelled and terminated by the County and provisions herein with respect to opportunity to cure default shall not be applicable.

36. <u>Contact Prohibition</u>: Direct contact with County departments other than Purchasing on the subject of this proposal is expressly forbidden except with the foreknowledge and permission of the Contract Officer. Violation may result in a determination that your firm is ineligible for an award.

All questions shall be in writing to the Contract Officer shown on the title page of the Request for Proposals (RFP). The respondents to this RFP shall not contact, either directly or indirectly, any other employee or agent of the County regarding this solicitation. Any such unauthorized contact may disqualify the offeror from this procurement.

37. <u>Additional Conditions</u>: The Conditions and Instructions in this solicitation are intended to apply to the resulting contract and shall supersede any conflicting terms offered. Any additional conditions an offeror intends be

considered must be submitted with the proposal and noted as an exception. Such exceptions may result in a finding that the submittal is 'non-responsive' to the proposal, negating possibility of an award to that offeror. Contractual documents submitted by the successful firm after an award will not be accepted.

- 38. Consultant Failure to Perform: Failure of the Consultant to perform the contract by reason of the County's non-acceptance of additional conditions submitted after the award shall result in termination of the contract by the County and may result in debarment of the Consultant for a period of up to three (3) years. Termination and /or debarment of the Consultant shall not constitute a waiver by the County of any other rights or remedies available to the County by law or contract.
- 39. <u>Conflict</u>: In the event of a conflict between the contract documents, including these Conditions and Instructions, the contract documents shall control.
- 40. Records and Inspection: The Consultant shall maintain full and accurate records with respect to all matters covered under this contract, including, without limitation, accounting records, written policies, procedures, time records, telephone records, and any other supporting evidence used to memorialize, reflect, and substantiate charges or fees related to this contract. The Consultant's records shall be open to inspection and subject to audit and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by the County and its employees, agents or authorized representatives after giving at least three (3) days' notice to the Consultant by the County. The County shall have access to such records from the effective date of this contract, for the duration of the contract, and for five (5) years after the date of final payment by the County to the Consultant pursuant to this contract or any renewal or extension of this contract. The County's employees, agents or authorized representatives shall have access to the Consultant's facilities, shall have access to all necessary records and shall be provided adequate and appropriate workspace, in order to conduct audits.
- 41. Rights and Remedies Not Waived: In no event shall the making by the County of any payment to the Consultant, or the waiver by the County of any provision under this contract including any obligation of the Consultant, constitute or be construed as a waiver by the County of any other provision, obligation, breach of covenant, or any default which may exist under this contract on the part of the Consultant, and the making of any such payment by the County while any such breach or default exists shall not impair or prejudice any right or remedies available to the County.
- 42. Entire Agreement: A resultant contract and any additional or supplementary documents incorporated herein by reference contain all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto, and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this contract or any part thereof shall have any validity or bind any of the parties hereto. The contract shall not be modified, altered, changed or amended unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 43. <u>Conflicts of Interests</u>: Consultant shall not accept or receive commissions or other payments from third parties for soliciting, negotiating, procuring, or effecting insurance on behalf of the County. The County may not procure supplies, equipment, materials or other goods from a consultant on the same project.
- 44. **Responsibility of Consultant:** The Consultant shall, without additional costs or fee to the County, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in his performance. Neither the County's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for any of the services required under this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of rights by the County, and the Consultant shall remain liable to the County for all costs which are incurred by the County as a result of the Consultant's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Agreement.
- 45. <u>Changes and Additions</u>: It shall be the responsibility of the Consultant to notify the County, in writing, of any necessary modifications or additions to the Scope of this Agreement. Compensation for changes or additions in the Scope of this Agreement will be negotiated and approved by the County, in writing.

It is understood and agreed to by both the County and the Consultant that such modifications or additions to this Agreement shall be made only by the full execution of the County's standard Agreement change order form. Furthermore, it is understood and agreed by both parties that any work done by the Consultant on such modification

or addition to this Agreement prior to the County's execution of its standard Agreement change order form shall be at the total risk of the Consultant and said work may not be compensated by the County.

- 46. <u>Exemption from Taxes</u>: The County is exempt from State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax. Tax Exemption Certificate indicating the County's tax-exempt status will be furnished by the County upon request.
- 47. <u>Debarment Status</u>: By submitting a proposal, proposers certify that they are not currently debarred by the Commonwealth of Virginia from submitting proposals or proposals on contracts for the type of goods and/or services covered by this solicitation, nor are they an agent of any person or entity that is currently so debarred.
- 48. <u>Safety</u>: All Consultants and sub-consultants performing services for the County are required and shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), State and County Safety and Occupational Health Standards and any other applicable rules and regulations. Also, all Consultants and sub-Consultants shall be held responsible for the safety of their employees and any unsafe acts or conditions that may cause injury or damage to any persons or property within and around the work site area under this contract.
- 49. <u>License Requirement</u>: All firms doing business in the County are required to be licensed in accordance with the County business license ordinance. Wholesale and retail merchants without a business location in the County are exempt from this requirement. Any questions concerning business licenses should be directed to the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office, telephone (757) 514-4260.
- 50. <u>Consultant's Form</u>: In cases where the County may accept the Consultant's form agreement, whereas certain standard clauses that may appear in the Consultant's form agreement cannot be accepted by the County, and in consideration of the convenience of using that form, and this form, without the necessity of negotiating a separate contract document, the parties hereto specifically agree that, notwithstanding any provisions appearing in the attached Consultant's form contract, the County's contract addendum shall prevail over the terms of the Consultant's agreement in the event of a conflict.
- 51. Offeror's Qualifications: Only proposals from established Consultant's for work similar in scope to work herein shall be considered; the County reserves the right to request specific reference information prior to award. Offeror shall demonstrate that they have adequate and appropriate manpower, tools and equipment to respond and perform in accordance with the provisions herein. The County may, at its option, disqualify an offeror and reject their proposal for cause. Reasons deemed to be sufficient for this action shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - Evidence of collusion among offerors.
 - Receipt of more than one proposal on any project from an individual, or from a corporation. This restriction does not apply to sub-consultants.
 - Default on any previous contract.
 - For unreasonable failure to complete a previous contract within the specified time or for being in arrears on an existing contract without reasonable cause for being in arrears.
 - Inability to perform as revealed by an investigation of the Proposer's financial statement, experience and/or plant and equipment.
 - Consultant does not meet project-specific requirements, as identified in the Contract Documents
- 52. <u>Pricing to be F.O.B. Destination Freight Allowed:</u> If goods are part of the agreement, pricing shall be F.O.B. destination-freight included for all competitive proposals. F.O.B. Destination-Freight Included shall include all shipping costs to the County location(s) at the unit cost. No additional shipping charges shall be allowed.
- Contract Quantities: The quantities, if shown, specified in the Request for Proposals are estimates only unless otherwise clearly noted, and are given for the information of offeror and for the purpose of proposal evaluation. They do not indicate the actual quantity that will be required, since such volume will depend upon requirements that may develop during the contract period. Quantities shown shall not be construed to represent any amount which the County shall be obligated to purchase under the contract or relieve the Consultant of his obligation to fill all orders placed by the County, except as clearly noted.

- 54. <u>Competition Intended</u>: It is the County's intent that the Request for Proposals (RFP) permits competition. It shall be the offeror's responsibility to advise the Buyer in writing if any language requirement, specification, etc., or any combination thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. Such notification must be received by the Purchasing Agent prior to the date set for receiving questions.
- 55. <u>Insurance:</u> The successful offeror shall procure, maintain, and provide proof of, insurance coverage for injuries to persons and/or property damage as may arise from or in conjunction with, the work performed on behalf of the County by the offeror, his agents, representatives, employees or sub-Consultants. Proof of coverage as contained herein shall be submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the commencement of work and such coverage shall be maintained by the offeror for the duration of the contract period; for occurrence policies. Claims made policies must be in force or that coverage purchased for three (3) years after contract completion date.

a. General Liability

Coverage shall be as broad as: Comprehensive General Liability endorsed to include Broad Form, Commercial General Liability Form including Products/Completed Operations.

Coverage sufficient to cover all vehicles owned, used, or hired by the offeror, his agents, representatives, employees or sub-Consultants.

\$5,000 Medical Expense Limit

c. Workers' Compensation

Limits as required by the Workers' Compensation Act of Virginia. Employers Liability, \$1,000,000.

- d. Professional Liability
 - 1. The successful offeror shall provide the County with an Errors and Omissions Liability Policy (E&O Policy). The policy shall cover the County for all sources of liability which would be covered by the latest edition of the standard Errors and Omissions Liability Coverage Form, as filed for use in the Commonwealth of Virginia by the Insurance Services Office, without the attachment of restrictive endorsements.
 - 2. The County policy shall be endorsed to include the County's officials, officers, agents and employees as insured. The E&O Policy shall include the successful offeror and the offeror's sub-Consultants of every tier as the offeror designated in the declarations.
 - 3. The minimum E&O Policy limits to be provided by the successful offeror (inclusive of any amounts provided by an umbrella or excess policy) shall be \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for

bodily injury liability and property damage liability. The limits afforded by the E&O Policy (or umbrella or excess policy with respect to it) shall apply only to the County and County's officials, officers, agents and employees and only to claims arising out of or in connection with the work under this contract.

4. Notice of Cancellation and/or Restriction - The policy must be specifically endorsed to provide the County with forty-five (45) days' notice of cancellation, non-renewal, change in coverage, and/or restriction.

e. Coverage Provisions

- 1. All deductibles or self-insured retention shall appear on the certificate(s).
- 2. The County, its' officers/ officials, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as "additional insured" as their interests may appear. This provision does not apply to Professional Liability or Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability.

- 7. Failure to comply with any reporting provisions of the policy(s) shall not affect coverage provided the County, its' officers/officials, agents, employees and volunteers.
- 8. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the County, its' officers/officials, agents, employees or volunteers for any act, omission or condition of premises which the parties may be held liable by reason of negligence.
- 9. The offeror shall furnish the County certificates of insurance including endorsements affecting coverage. The certificates are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurance company(s) to bind coverage on its' behalf, if executed by a broker, notarized copy of authorization to bind, or certify coverage must be attached.
- 10. All insurance shall be placed with insurers maintaining an A.M. Best rating of no less than an A: VII. If A.M. Best rating is less than A: VII, approval must be received from County's Risk Officer.
- 11. All coverage designated herein shall be as broad as the Insurance Services Office (ISO) forms filed for use with the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- 56. **Payments to Sub-Consultants:** Within seven days after receipt of amounts paid by the County for work performed by a sub-Consultant under this contract, the Consultant shall either:
 - a. Pay the Sub-Consultant for the proportionate share of the total payment received from the County attributable to the work performed by the Sub-Consultant under this contract; or,

b. Notify the County and Sub-Consultant, in writing, of his intention to withhold all or a part of the Sub-Consultant's payment and the reason for non-payment.

The Consultant shall pay interest to the Sub-Consultant on all amounts owed that remain unpaid beyond the seven-day period except for amounts withheld as allowed in item b. above.

Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this contract, interest shall accrue at the rate of one percent per month.

The Consultant shall include in each of its subcontracts a provision requiring each Sub-Consultant to include or otherwise be subject to the same payment and interest requirements as set forth above with respect to each lower-tier sub-Consultant.

The Consultant's obligation to pay an interest charge to a Sub-Consultant pursuant to this provision may not be construed to be an obligation of the County.

- Ownership of Documents: Any reports, specifications, blueprints, negatives or other documents prepared by the Consultant in the performance of its obligations under the resulting contract shall be the exclusive property of County, and all such materials shall be returned to the owner upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this contract. The Consultant shall not use, willingly allow, or cause such materials to be used for any purpose other than performance of all Consultant's obligations under the resulting contract without the prior written consent of County. Documents and materials developed by the Consultant under the resulting contract shall be the property of County; however, the Consultant may retain file copies, which cannot be used without prior written consent of the Owner. County agrees that the Consultant shall not be liable for any damage, loss, or injury resulting from the future use of the provided documents for other than the project specified when the Consultant is not the firm of record.
- 58. <u>Submissions:</u> All project correspondence, design/review documents, reports, etc. prepared by the Consultant shall be distributed to the County's Project Manager for each task in the format and number of copies as directed by the task statement of work.

Within thirty (30) days of project completion, the Consultant shall prepare and submit a Project Completion Report with project closeout documents and submit to the County's Project Manager.

- 59. <u>Default on Taxes:</u> The County reserves the right to withhold payment to any contractor that is in arrears, or in default to the County on any debt or Contract, or that has defaulted as a surety, or otherwise on any obligation to the County.
- 60. <u>Contractual Disputes:</u> The Consultant shall give written notice to the Purchasing Officer of his intent to file a claim for money or other relief at the time of the occurrence or the beginning of the work upon which the claim is to be based.

The written claim shall be submitted to the Purchasing Officer no later than sixty (60) days after final payment. If the claim is not disposed of by agreement, the Purchasing Officer shall reduce his decision in writing and mail or otherwise forward a copy thereof to the Consultant within thirty (30) days of receipt of the claim.

The Purchasing Officer's decision shall be final unless the Consultant appeals within thirty (30) days by submitting a written letter of appeal to the County Administrator, or his designee. The County Administrator shall render a decision within sixty (60) days of receipt of the appeal.

61. **Responsibility for Making Corrections:** The Consultant shall, without additional costs or fee to the County, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its performance, the County's review, approval, or acceptance of, or payment of any of the services required under the contract shall be deemed a waiver of rights by the County as a result of the Engineer's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under the contract.
